## Is It From God?

Compared to the number of all books ever written, there are not many in the world that claim to be inspired of God. But of those books that do claim inspiration, the Bible stands out among them all. In this article I will begin to show you that the Bible does indeed claim to be from God, and then in later articles the proof of that inspiration will actually be given.

You may think that showing that the Bible says it is inspired would be real easy. After all, aren't their all kinds of "thus saith the Lord's" in it? Yes, there are, but almost all of these are found in the Old Testament. Furthermore, the New Testament references to scripture refer back to the Old Testament most of the time. So lets focus on the New Testament. Can you give me a verse that says that the New testament is inspired of God? Come on now, don't dawdle, give me the

verses! You see, there are many people who it seems don't understand Biblical inspiration like they ought to, and they do not understand how the Bible claims to have been given from God to man.

It is obviously important that the Bible (the New Testament in particular) claim that it is the word of God. If a claim is not made, then the Bible will be lacking in foundation and clarity. To illustrate, how could one know if a man is a king if that man did not claim to be a king? Could the man exercise authority over his subjects without invoking the authority of a king? Obviously not. And neither may the New Testament serve as the inspired words and commands of God for us today without claiming to be such. On the other hand, a man is not king just because he says he is. Neither is the Bible the inspired Word simply because it claims to be.

### New Testament Claims

**It is obviously important that the Bible (the New Testament in particular) claim that it is the word of God. If a claim is not made, then the Bible will be lacking in foundation and clarity.**

The Bible speaks of its own inspiration in different ways. The central figure in the New Testament claims for its own inspiration is Jesus Christ.

In John 12:49, Christ himself says *"For I have not spoken of myself; but the Father which sent me, He gave me a commandment, what I should say, and what I should speak."* Thus all the statements of Jesus in the Bible boldly proclaim the New Testament's inspiration, for the Father and Son speak as one. The very purpose of the Scriptures is to bring salvation to mankind. II Timothy 3:15 says the Scriptures make men *"wise unto salvation through the faith which is in Christ Jesus."* The Bible does this in the New Testament by giving us the testimony of Jesus (**Luke 24:46,47; Heb. 10:7; Rev. 19:10**). Therefore the New Testament claims to give us the Testimony of Jesus and God's plan for man's salvation. --Tim McHenry
