Righteousness Exalteth A Nation

"Righteousness exalteth a nation; but sin is a reproach to any people."
Proverbs 14:34. These wise words need to be heeded in a country like ours today. It is a shame when countries not based on Christian principles are more just with their people than we are in the United States. Now don't get me wrong, we live in a great country, but I am speaking of the judicial system in particular. It is possible to go to countries in the world where hurting and taking from other people results in punishment that will protect the innocent (such as in some of the Middle East countries). Oh no! Did I use a form of the word "punish?" Yes, I did. It is a perversion of the truth to say that punishment is not a godly motivation to get people to do what is right.

Now there are two problems about which Christians as citizens should be concerned. The first is that we have all seen how that criminals are coddled in some cases. Why should this be? Since when do love and mercy cancel out justice? God is all righteous and all loving; there is no contradiction. Our God is longsuffering and merciful, but that does not mean sin will go unpunished. Let us consider an irresponsible person who is, say, a drug abuser (and yes, alcohol is a drug). This man will not respond to treatment or counseling. What shall we do with him? Maybe he will respond to punishment. What if that doesn't work? What if he's a drunk driver who is a special menace to others? Lock him up. "But," some may say, "don't you know that prisons are already overcrowded?" I don't care. Pack 'em in like rats. If they are going to behave as an animal then let them live like one, it's their choice. I don't know where we got the idea that a criminal has a right to so many square feet of private space or that he needs cable TV. Even if you call those "rights," he lost them when he beat his wife, stole from his neighbor, refused to pay his taxes, or whatever. Of course, we should let the punishment fit the crime and also make sure he is *guilty* of it. Now let us consider the second problem area. The government needs to stay out of the church and the home when it comes to taking away responsibilities that belong to the elders or mommy and daddy. Don't be telling my child that what is right and wrong depends upon what they feel or that the church cannot exercise effective discipline.

If we will all exercise the Christian influence that we have, maybe these things will get better instead of worse. Are you doing your part as a citizen and a Christian?
