“THE LAST PUBLIC HANGING” IN RETROSPECT

In the November 1993 edition of the magazine **Kentucky Living**, there is an article with the title, “The Last Public Hanging” by Mel Tharp. In the article, Mr. Tharp gives an eyewitness account of the last official public hanging in the United States. Mr. Tharp’s article was laced with negative images concerning the hanging of Rainey Bethea. Bethea was convicted of raping an elderly lady who he also supposedly robbed and murdered.

Mr. Tharp begins in his first paragraph by speaking of the hanging as the cause of conjuring “up the thought of **violent** death” (Emphasis mine, TM). In his last paragraph, Mr. Tharp says “all I could see was a youngster” in reference to Mr. Bethea. The author concluded by saying, “I hope I never have to watch anything like it again.”

Now it was not for me to determine Rainey Bethea’s guilt or innocence. Also, I do not really know what Mr. Tharp’s position on hanging or capital punishment is. However, I would like to take the opportunity to say a few words about the subject, especially since America has changed so much since 1936 when this hanging occurred. Punishment should not be looked upon with sadistic glee, but, quite frankly folks, we need more hangings. Not just hangings, but simply punishment in general given to those who deserve it by those authorized to dish it out. Let me explain my reasoning behind that.

Compared to 1936, do we feel more or less secure on the street and in our homes? Compared to 1936, I wonder if there are more or less mothers and other loved ones weeping over the grave of someone whose innocent blood has been shed by evildoers. How many times does a drunk driver have to kill someone before we “get tough” with him these days.

It is the lack of respect for authority and even life itself that demands that we punish those who do evil. God has clearly shown us that this is His way. ***"Whoso sheddeth man's blood, by man shall his blood be shed: for in the image of God made he man." Genesis 9:6 "And if a man have committed a sin worthy of death, and he be to be put to death, and thou hang him on a tree..." Deuteronomy 21:22*** When Paul was speaking he indicated that he willingly lived under a capital punishment system by saying, ***"For if I be an offender, or have committed any thing worthy of death, I refuse not to die: but if there be none of these things whereof these accuse me, no man may deliver me unto them. I appeal unto Caesar." Acts 25:11*** In fact, Paul taught by inspiration that the Government has the authority to punish them that do wrong even to the point of death. ***"Let every soul be subject unto the higher powers. For there is no power but of God: the powers that be are ordained of God. Whosoever therefore resisteth the power, resisteth the ordinance of God: and they that resist shall receive to themselves damnation. For rulers are not a terror to good works, but to the evil. Wilt thou then not be afraid of the power? do that which is good, and thou shalt have praise of the same: for he is the minister of God to thee for good. But if thou do that which is evil, be afraid; for he beareth not the sword in vain: for he is the minister of God, a revenger to [execute] wrath upon him that doeth evil." Romans 13:1-5.***

What we need in America today is a few more hangings, a few more electrocutions, a few more lethal injections, and I’m not being bloodthirsty by saying that. I would that not even one single person should wrong another, but we cannot be blind to the fact that it happens. I simply yearn for a nation that recognizes that there is such a thing as evil, and it is a just thing for the government to punish those that practice evil and praise them that do well. Somewhere along the line we got it backwards.
