EVEN A DOG KNOWS

Our family dog, Cocoa, died a few days ago. She had become suddenly sick and started to keep her distance. On her last night she came back to her den, lay down by her 5week-old puppies and died. Her last instinct was probably to go to them, it was a cold and rainy night. I found them next to her body in the morning.

How is it that an animal operating by instinct knows more than a human being, made in the image of God? Romans 1:31 teaches us that some who gave up on God were without “natural affection”. This term for family love is only found in the negative in the Bible. God just expects you to have it. Just as an animal is given instinct we are given to love and compassion.

So how is it that we have things like:

Abortion – a woman purposely has her child murdered by a so-called doctor. Recently, in Texas they passed a law that some howled against. The law said the “doctors” doing these abortions had to have the same proficiency as regular doctors to admit to the hospital. Evidently this rules out a lot of abortion “doctors.” I guess it doesn’t take much talent to certify someone to kill babies. Neither these mothers nor those doctors have natural affection for children.

Gambling – not just the kind we’ve always had in back alleys and smoky rooms. I’m talking state sponsored, addictive, fleecing of poor and ignorant people to pad the government’s accounts. How many children come home to no milk and bread in the fridge because dad got caught up in trying to “win it big” at the convenience store? Neither the parents or those involved in this industry are thinking about the effects of their actions. Such gambling should be understood as naturally wrong for societies and families and is in the category of works of the flesh in Galatians 5 (i.e. “such like” sins).

Latch-key kids – they come home from school with a million things their parents have lined up for them to do, everything from ball to bath time. However, Mommy and Daddy are busy working for that new house. They have their hobbies they never gave up from youth. They don’t really know their children and think they are doing good by throwing

money and activities (continued from page 3)...at them when they really need you to listen to them and do something together with them. Do these parents ask their children about matters of right and wrong? No. Do they care more about them getting a scholarship than in picking a good, Christian husband or wife? Yes. They don't even really know what love for their child is. They are without true affection. We can learn a lot from the natural world and how God made us. He doesn't have to spell out the details of every single sin for us to know when we do not love as we naturally should.
