## Local Evangelism Report

I will have more and different things to say in this column as time goes on. For now, I just wanted to give you a brief report and tell you what you can expect in this report.

The monthly evangelism report is just that. It contains a run-down of the visits made by your preacher and focuses on some aspect of our church work and how it can be used to evangelize. Expect to hear about our local work in the Nursing Home regularly.

Number of visits made in June: 26

Many things could be counted as a visit. When I make a monthly evangelism report, I am referring to a personal visit to someone's home or work, or a visit to the funeral home, nursing home, or hospital. Multiple individuals in a family are counted as one visit. Calling someone on the phone to encourage them, invite them to come to church, or discuss some spiritual matter is a good work. However, I don't personally count these as a visit for the purpose of this report (it would be hard to keep track of). I don't count my wife's visits (same reasons). The information on personal visits is provided for you because I wish for you to think of Monroe Co. as a missionary field. We expect our missionaries to make timely reports on their work in the field. You all pay me for full-time work and I want to tell you what you're getting for it.

This first month has been very hectic what with all the moving and stuff. Expect to see the number for personal visits go up to 40 or 50 for a full month. Some months (like July) will not be "full" because I will be at a Gospel Meeting or lectureship, or somewhere with my family on vacation, etc. You are encouraged (as the elders have already done) to go visiting with me.
