7. We attend their public school open house but do not attend the open house on the closing day of Vacation Bible School?
8. We will not take our vacation so as to cause them to miss any school, but we have no qualms of conscience about our vacation during the time of VBS or a gospel meeting.
9. They see us go to work even though we do not feel too well, but stay at home from church services under the same circumstances?
10. They see us avidly look at and study their school work, but never pay any attention at all to the handwork brought home from their Bible classes?

Yes, with such situations prevailing, what priorities are being established in the hearts of our children?
