A Teacher Who Couldn't Read

John Corcoran seemed to be a normal high school teacher. He had the qualifications: a bachelor's degree and several additional hours of graduate work. For years he taught

English, social studies and world history. But in time he was overloaded because of a personal secret that could no longer be kept silent: John Corcoran couldn't read.

John had bluffed his way through life. He made it through high school and college by having his girlfriend to type papers for him or by buying essays from other college students. As a teacher - an odd choice for an occupation to say the least - he had his students to read aloud from textbooks and relied on class discussions and oral exams to get by. When he finally realized that he could continue the masquerade no longer, he revealed his hidden problem and went to a center to learn to read.

Isn't it amazing that this man could hide this problem for so long? Not really, because many do the same thing in their spiritual life. Many who are lost pretend that everything is all right. They will not admit to themselves that they are lost and hell bound. They need to listen to the words of Paul: "Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap" (Gal. 6:7).

Others are like John Corcoran because they pretend to be what they really aren't: Christians. As someone has said, a hypocrite is someone who is not himself on Sunday. Like the Pharisees of Jesus' day, these pretenders "outwardly appear righteous unto men" but inside they are "full of hypocrisy and iniquity" (Matt. 23:28).
